Founded in 2017, Sligo Sudbury School provides a unique, self-directed educational environment for young people aged 5-18. Since its inception the school has experienced exponential growth. The school currently serves 86 children and by 2032, we plan to grow to a community of 240; 215 students and 25 staff.
