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About Us

Sligo Sudbury School is Ireland's largest democratic school and one of the largest in the world. Founded in 2017 by former school principal Gayle Nagle and home-educating parent Maura Duignan, we set out to address critical gaps in Ireland's education system. Like the Educate Together movement, which transformed schools through diversity and inclusion, we are redefining education through self-directed learning, student empowerment, and strong, supportive school communities.

As a democratic school, we give students aged 5 to 18 the freedom to take charge of their own education. There are no compulsory lessons or standardised curriculla—students learn through real-world experiences, personal interests, and meaningful collaboration. This model fosters confidence, independence, and a lifelong love of learning.

Built entirely through private philanthropic support, with no state funding, we have created a thriving school community, trained educators, influenced policy, co-founded Democratic Education Ireland, and helped launch three additional democratic schools.

Now, with 82 students enrolled and growing demand, we are expanding. Our next step is The CEIDE Project—the first Centre of Excellence in Ireland for Democratic Education. This will allow us to serve 240 students and staff while strengthening our national impact. More than just a school expansion, CEIDE will put Sligo on the map as the go-to destination for progressive education, a hub for pioneering educational models, teacher training, and policy innovation.

Over the next 90 days, we aim to secure €1.5 million in funding partnerships to make this vision a reality. Long-term, we are committed to democratising education—making it more accessible, student-centred, and future-focused—so every child can receive a personalised, values-driven education that prepares them for life.



An Innovative Solution

The current education system is failing to equip students for the modern world. Its rigid, one-size-fits-all structure stifles creativity, individuality, and personal growth, leaving many students disengaged, disillusioned, and unprepared for future challenges. This is reflected in low university progression rates and a growing demand for alternative education, with more families turning to homeschooling or independent schools. The need for a more adaptive and personalised approach to learning is urgent.

Most people can relate to the fact that their deepest and most valuable learning experiences come from what they have discovered for themselves. This is the foundation of self-directed learning—when students have the freedom to explore their interests, they develop a strong sense of self along with critical thinking, problem-solving, and self-motivation skills that prepare them for life, not just exams.

Our solution is democratic education—a model built on choice, freedom, and self-directed learning. Students take ownership of their education in a way that is meaningful to them, fostering independence, curiosity, and a lifelong love of learning.

The CEIDE Project will establish Sligo as Ireland's national hub for democratic education. With expanded resources, we will scale this model, empowering families and educators to reshape education and give more children the opportunity to thrive.




Empowered Learners, Inspired Lives

"Without a shadow of a doubt, our family life is incredibly better since our children started at Sligo Sudbury School. It has been the best decision we ever made for our boys and our family as a whole."

Words cannot express how happy we are after her first week at Sudbury. Today was the first Monday in forever that she's looked forward to the day ahead! She gets up happy and excited, she comes home happy and excited. The knot in our tummy that we've had for years now is finally dispersing. Her anxiety has dramatically improved. I can come home after dropping her off and not spend the time worrying, for the first time in years. It's been utterly life-changing." Our daughter (14 years old) is the happiest she has ever been (and we were going to very good traditional schools before). The community is vibrant and we're looking forward to the next months and years at Sligo Sudbury."

What sets Sligo Sudbury apart is its ability to provide a level of fulfillment and happiness for students that traditional schools often fail to offer. For parents who have tried conventional routes, the joy their children experience here is something they never anticipated—and it's a joy they now look forward to every day.

Wider Societal Impact

As children today inherit an increasingly complex and uncertain world, they must be equipped not just to cope, but to solve the pressing challenges of the future. However, a narrow and inadequate vision of education persists, leaving many ill-prepared. A recent Irish study revealed that only 13% of employers believe graduates are adequately prepared for the workforce. Employers highlight the importance of "soft" skills—communication, teamwork, problem-solving, and work ethic—which are essential for the future but often lacking in students due to a disconnect between what is taught and what is needed. 
